

June 12, 1905

#### "THIS IS THE VERY PLACE"

Ellen G. White, a founder of the Seventh-day Adventist Church and ardent supporter of both education and healthful living, first visited here on June 12, 1905. She and her son, Willie, arrived by express wagon from Redlands and met John Burden, who two weeks earlier had put a \$1,000 deposit to hold the bankrupt property which the former owners had renamed "Loma Linda."

While viewing the buildings and grounds, Ellen White said: "Willie, I have been here before."

He responded, "No, Mother. You have never been here."

"Then this is the very place the Lord has shown me, for it is all familiar," she answered.

Although Mrs. White had never been to Loma Linda before, she recognized the property as the very place she had seen in vision nearly four years earlier.

Emphasizing the need to move forward with the purchase of the land, she told the group, "We must have this place. We should reason from cause to effect. The Lord has not given us this property for any common purpose."
